THE GALLOWAY TOWNSHIP RAIN GARDEN



A RAIN GARDEN is a garden which takes advantage of rainfall and stormwater runoff in its overall design and plant selection. This garden has been specifically placed here to accomplish three important tasks:

 To help drain stormwater away from the parking lot
To enhance water quality by filtering out pollutants as rainwater slowly drains through the soil and specialized plants
To create a habitat with native plants designed to attract pollinators and wildlife indigenous to New Jersey

BASIN PLANTS
